J Tate and L Bird could not be present; two members of the public were in attendance. Council members are very concerned about the state of village footways and footpaths, especially where residents themselves have the responsibility for their present condition: For Jubilee Lane, repeated appeals for dog owners to clear up after their pets have gone unheeded; the grass will not be cut there because it is so badly fouled with dog excrement that the volunteers who used to do the work now refuse to do so as it is too filthy a job. There are still overgrown hedges obstructing the pavements in The Street; further action was considered. There was praise for "Streetscene" who maintain the verges. The health and safety of all those who use the Lane and pavements are at risk if conditions don't improve, so the Council appeals to dog owners & householders to play their part in keeping our village attractive and safe. Other items on the agenda were: Finance, various small items of expenditure were considered & approved. A planning application at 46, The Street is under consideration; an application at 40, The Street was approved. The NALC revised version of the Code of Conduct has been adopted. The following points arose from the Council Meeting held on Thursday, 12th July at 7.30 p.m.:- 1. Stephen Reynolds was co-opted on to the Council to fill the vacancy caused by the retirement of Peter Coster. 2. Gary Phillips (husband of Caroline, the Clerk) was appointed as Responsible Financial Officer to serve on a voluntary unpaid basis. 3. A new Code of Conduct was adopted as required by the Localism Act The version promulgated by the Norfolk Association of Local Councils was preferred. 4. A SLOW sign has now been painted on the A1066 on the approach to the village from Diss. This was the most the Highways Authority would do in response to appeals to move back the 30 mph sign to slow traffic down entering the village. 5. Contact has been made with the dog warden employed by Breckland Council in connection with the fouling of village footpaths by certain dogs. It is accepted that most dog owners in the village behave responsibly with their animals. Unfortunately, there is a minority who disregard good practice with unpleasant results. The warden, Mike Gardiner, (01362 858500, email mike@animalwardenservices.co.uk) will be patrolling the area with his staff to check up on dog-owner behaviour. If anyone observes an owner allowing his dog to foul the footpath, could he or she please notify the warden. 6. The Council decided to offer the residue of the Malson legacy (£164) to St. Andrews Church for the repair and maintenance of the organ. 7. It was reported that Lophams' Links has now abandoned its proposal to construct a children's play area in the garden of the White Horse. They have reverted to their previous idea of setting it up at the Village Hall if sufficient funds can be raised.
