North Lopham Parish Council: 8th May

Heather Potter (Chair) and Jan Tate (Vice Chair) were re-elected for further terms. No applications for the vacancy on the PC received so attempts will be made to co-opt a new member. Norfolk CC intend to set 20mph speed limits around all schools, St Andrew's is on their list so we await developments. Affordable Housing and Play Area: No progress. Letchmere drainage: No progress MC will pursue. Finance: The audited accounts for the last year were examined, agreed & signed. Planning: 14A The Street was approved; 73 The Street is pending. Village Plan: A meeting will take place to investigate the process and costs of producing a 'Village Plan', designating areas where residents do not want housing development to take place. Roads and Footpaths: the worst pot holes have been repaired. By the end of May, preparations for the resurfacing of roads through the village should have begun and the resurfacing should take place during June. It is not clear how far down Tanns and Kings Head Lanes the works will go. More complaints about the noise, frequency and speed of HGVs passing through the

village have been received. Tribunal about proposed rights of way will take place on 3rd/4th September. The War Graves Commission will re-erect/repair the G Morduant headstoneFederation of St Andrew's, North Lopham and All Saints, Winfarthing schools; no objections were raised. The recent litter pick was a success - thanks go to Cllr Bird and her team. Correspondence: Mr. J Rednall reported that a deer had been killed on his land, in view of his children, by a walker's uncontrolled dog. He requested that walkers be reminded that, when using footpaths crossing farmland, their dogs must be under close control, preferably on a lead.
