In particular, he urged the meeting to take some action concerning the speed of heavy lorries coming into the village from Thetford. 4) David Huggins reminded the meeting about the forthcoming firework evening at the Village Hall on 3rd November. 5) Steve Reynolds gave a report on the village website. It seems to be attracting increased interest.
