North Lopham Parish Council

Met on 13th November 2013. Six members of the public attended a lively meeting. Rights of way tribunal: 4 out of 5 routes have been adopted subject to no objections being received by 15th Nov 2013. Neighbourhood plan: Parish Clerk to consult with Mrs Farren-Bradley about this and report. Drains in Tanns Lane: Councillor McManus reported that the concrete manhole cover at the top of Tanns Lane is in a dangerous condition and that the benches by the pond need retreating. He also reported that he is unable to continue to maintain the pond margins and trees although he will continue to help with the 'Village Clean Ups'. The dangerous manhole cover will be reported to NCC & bsp. Conservation area at the cemetery: waiting for Spring. Road sweeping: road sweeper does not go right to the bottom of Tanns Lane. Parish Clerk will contact NCC about this. Rangers: need more work if the village is to continue to receive the service. A notice will be posted in the King's Head for members of the public to suggest tasks for the Rangers to do. Dog fouling: It's good that dog owners are using bags to clean up but please put them in the bins not in the bushes! Traffic Calming: 20mph restriction by the school is delayed due to lack of funding. 'Think' signs to be installed. VAS flashing speed sign would require £3,000 funding; a cost comparison with 20mph speed limit signs will be made. Recycling: Breckland are to revise recycling arrangements; more news awaited. Solar Farm: A public information meeting is set to be held at the Village Hall on 29th November 4-7pm about plans to install a large solar farm between High Common Road and the A1066. In view of the very short notice given, the Council plans to inform all residents about the proposals and encourage them to attend. A Vote of thanks to Mike Cox was made for all his work as Parish Clerk. Next Meeting: 8th January 2014. Can anyone help to maintain the pond? If there's anyone out there who's prepared to help tidy round the pond on a regular basis, please contact the Parish Clerk on 01379 688298 for further details.

John Crisp was elected Chairman for the meeting held 14th November 2013 and to act until the January meeting. Apologies were received from Steve Reynolds, Rob Webb, and Jim Pursehouse. Granville Horan (Lopham's Society) and Julie Crossley (North Lopham Clerk) were also in attendance. The minutes of the meeting held 12th September 2013 were approved and there were no matters arising. The Financial Officer, Gary Phillips, presented a draft precept budget for 2014/15 and answered Councillors queries. Different aspects were discussed at some length after which Councillors were reminded that a final decision must be made at the January 2014 meeting. The conversion to online banking has been further delayed; the Council's account is an 'old style account' and simple conversion is not possible but Councillors agreed unanimously to continue the change when possible. A short report was read concerning highways and there were no specific matters concerning planning, community matters and works. Granville Horan reported to the meeting concerning the recent fireworks evening and quiz and reminded everyone about the Christmas Drop-In which will be held at the Village Hall on 13th December 2013. There was considerable discussion regarding the recent communication from Richard Pike Associates relating to a Solar Farm development locally. This is of great importance to everyone and an open meeting (at present) is scheduled for 29th November 2013 in the Village Hall but further details are awaited and will be communicated to everyone via notices and personal communication as soon as possible. Regretfully Caroline Phillips, our Clerk, is to resign her position following the next meeting of the Council.
