# **North Lopham Parish Council**

25 residents (including several who had very recently moved into the village) joined in the 'Spring Clean' on 6th March. In glorious weather about 16 bags of rubbish were collected from around the village and, in the area of the pond, the shrubs were tidied, twigs cleared and leaves raked-up. Thanks to all who participated ... and thanks to George and Angie at The Kings Head for the very welcome refreshments after the event. Concern was expressed at the Parish Council meeting on 10th March about the apparent increase in 'dogfouling' in and around the village - often right in the middle of footpaths. We have three 'dog-bins' - please use them and be considerate to other users of the paths. There was more discussion of the project to have 'The Lanes' to the west of The Street registered as Public Rights of Way. Despite some opposition the Parish Council voted by a narrow majority to send the evidence which has been collected in recent months to the Legal Department at Norfolk County Council to set the process in motion.



There was some discussion of the changes, proposed by Breckland, to the Settlement Boundary. We await the full consultation document later in the Spring, when the Council (and individuals) will have the opportunity to make a formal response. Unfortunately, we have been informed that the piece of land which had been identified as most suitable for a 'safe play area' within the village cannot be made available. Any more suggestions or offers would be much appreciated. The next meeting will be Wednesday May 12th. The Annual Village Open Meeting will start at 7pm and the Parish Council AGM will follow (probably starting about 8 pm). Please put the date in your diary now!

# **South Lopham Parish Council**

Please make a note of the date of the 2010 Village Meeting - April 16th - in the Village Hall. We shall begin at 7.30pm but you are welcome to join us from 7pm onwards. The Chairman will give his annual report on the Council's work. Representatives from all organisations in the village are invited to say a few words if they wish and of course the floor is open to all for questions and comment. The meeting is also the occasion of the South Lopham Village Society's AGM. Light refreshments will be available.

At the meeting on March 11th councillors were pleased to hear that the extension of the 30mph limit on the Blo Norton Rd is now in operation but were disappointed that a similar extension of the limit on the 1066 at the Eastern end has been refused. A site meeting to discuss the matter will be requested. The road damage and standing water caused by the harsh weather have been, and will continue to be, reported to Highways in an effort to secure the mending of potholes and unblocking of drains and culverts. The Council has also been corresponding with Breckland Planners and will ask a representative to join us at a meeting for a discussion on the role of the Parish Council in the planning process. The 'purchase' of the red telephone kiosk is still undecided as is the spending of the £1000 bequest to the village by the late Bernice Malsom. Both will be matters for discussion at the Village Meeting.

We ask all residents to be vigilant regarding **fly tipping**. Recently a large number of car tyres were thrown from the bridge on Low Common Road, interrupting the flow of the river and moving downstream towards the Fen. Should anyone see or hear of similar acts anywhere around the village, please do not hesitate to contact **Breckland Council on 01362 853296** with details, if possible including registration numbers of any vehicles involved.
