### **Little Ouse Headwaters Project**

**Public Meeting** - A public launch of this new venture for the Little Ouse Headwaters Project will take place on Wednesday 13th April at Garboldisham Village Hall at 7.30pm. Following initial presentations, individual project leaders will be on hand to explain and discuss the details withmembers of the public and invite their participation.

This exciting new project offers a wonderful opportunity for local people to indulge their interests in a wide range of activities while at the same time contributing to preserving our heritage and records for future generations. There will be scope to learn and become enjoyably involved. Whilethemain priority is landscape and wildlife conservation the project will also investigate local social history and the creation of a community archive, old maps, architecture and the capture of oral memories, natural history and ecology. There will be room for creative art and writing as well as photography. Both the University of East Anglia & the Sainsbury Centre for the Visual Arts are involved in leading parts of the project. Garboldisham Church Primary School is already actively involved. The project has been approved and funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and will last for three years. #### **North Lopham Parish Council**

The March meeting was attended by 7 Councillors, Cllr. William Nunn from Breckland and 7 members of the public. Highways and Footpaths: Barhale have repaired those road surface defects attributable to them. Councillor Tate has reported 6 further potholes and some damage to road signs to Highways. The overflowing drain water in Church Road is contaminated by effluent - Environmental Health have been contacted to trace the source. The water flooding Tanns Lane has been tested. It is run-off from neighbouring fields escaping from blocked ditches. Highways will be contacted. Parked vehicles obstructing footpaths should be reported to the police. Village Spring Clean: It was suggested that this year clearing Jubilee Lane of fallen trees should be the focus as the litter warden is proving very effective at clearing rubbish. Date to be advised. Other Matters: Egg throwing - £300 worth of vehicle damage occurred in one instance alone. Egg vendors have agreed to empty or secure their stalls at night. Residents should report incidents to the police. Allotments: the Methodists are still considering allowing the use of the field behind the Chapel, especially if young people are involved. Thanks to Ted Young for helping to clean the benches at the mere and varnishing the notice board and to Jan Tate for painting the rail. A Council Open Meeting will held at the Village Hall on April 15th at 7.30pm. Council Elections are due in May.
