North Lopham Parish Council

The meeting on 14th July was attended by Community Police Officer, Paul Borman, Robert McCaw, Chair of SLPC, Granville Horan of SL Village Society and several parishioners. Highways -After a recent NCC inspection of village roads, the Council was astonished to be told that areas of concern were not dangerous and need not be repaired. However, Barhale are shortly to inspect various sunken areas attributed to their work. Safer Neighbourhoods Action Panel (SNAP) - A deputation from the village made representations at the SNAP meeting on 24th June at Attleborough about various safety issues including speeding, lack of footpaths and parking near the school. North Lopham has consequently been made a SNAP priority, enabling the police to concentrate resources on this area at key times - PC Borman said that over the past week speed checks have resulted in numerous warnings, seven fixed penalties and one prosecution (56mph). Heavy lorries have been stopped to check that they need access, with the issue of one fixed penalty. Parking near the school will be addressed by a visit before the end of term and a leaflet campaign to increase awareness. PC Borman stressed the importance of reporting all traffic related incidents, including 'near misses' and incidents where property is damaged without personal injury, within 24 hours so that an accurate picture of problem areas can be built up before the situation is reviewed at the next SNAP meeting on 26th August and further action taken as deemed necessary. South Lopham Society Granville Horan outlined the SLS history and aims which include welcoming new residents and running functions with a social emphasis such as quizzes and barbecues. North Lopham residents have supported past events so will be invited to join the committee and to help shape the future of the society. Co-option of New Parish Councillor -Lindsey Westbrook-Lay was co-opted to fill the vacancy left by Brian Frith's retirement. She agreed to serve as the new Chairperson. The lack of affordable housing is an ongoing concern, forcing young couples and families out of the village. All attempts so far to identify suitable land to develop have failed. Dog fouling is a persistent and objectionable problem in Primrose and Jubilee Lanes and could be a public health issue. A request from the floor was made that Clean it Up signs be erected. Residents are urged to ensure that hedges & overhanging trees are kept trimmed.

South Lopham Parish Council

The following points arose out of the Parish

Council meeting held on 8th July. 1) Jim Pursehouse was co-opted on to the Council to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Evelyn Logsdail. 2) The Chairman reported on the outcome of a meeting with the Planning Department of Breckland Council. There was a useful exchange of views as to the planning procedures, practices and difficulties. It is hoped that the meeting will lead to closer co-operation and consultation between Breckland and the Parish Councils. 3) Regarding the Local Development Framework the meeting was surprised to learn of a proposal from Breckland Council to delete the Settlement Boundary. A copy of the proposal including a plan is displayed in the bus shelter along with the draft minutes of the meeting. Comments in writing to The Clerk at Oxfootstone Granary, Brick Kiln Lane, South Lopham, IP22 2JS (email: mail@oxfoot.co.uk). 4) Steps are being taken to improve the visibility of the 30 mph signs on the A1066. 5) There is a proposal that the South Lopham Village Society should become the Lophams Village Society by including North Lopham. Discussions are taking place. 6) Progress is continuing with the purchase of the telephone kiosk at Primrose Lane and the erection of a new notice board outside St. Andrew's Church.
