At the 13th January a presentation was made by Breckland Council explaining their **Mobile Council Service**. This involves a bus calling at villages once per month to provide various services, e.g. help with any Council related matter such as Council Tax, other Council services, entitlement to benefits and a course on use of computers and accessing the Internet. Telephone Kiosk - The main proposal was to invite villagers to submit works of art or handicraft or poetry for display in the kiosk. The Council agreed to make a contribution

towards the "Lopham Links" proposal to construct a children's play area. This idea is still at an early stage but it is enthusiastically supported in both North and South Lopham. There was a long discussion of a proposal from Norfolk County Council for the Parish Council to take on more local works such as grass cutting, weed control, gritting roads and paths, looking after road signs and various other functions currently provided by the County Council. There was also discussion about the proposed **Localism Bill** which is much in the news at the moment.
