North Lopham Parish Council

The Annual Parish Open Meeting will start at 7pm on Wednesday 12th May in the Methodist Schoolroom. We will have reports from many village groups and from our District and County Councillor William Nunn, and there will be plenty of opportunity for members of the public to ask questions and make comments and suggestions regarding all aspects of our village. The Open Meeting will be followed by the AGM, at which Officers will be elected for the coming year and the accounts for 2009/2010 will be presented prior to audit. All members of the public are very welcome to attend; we usually have about 20 members of the public present for the Open Meeting, so you won't be alone!

South Lopham Parish Council

Forty residents attended the **Annual Village Meeting** at the Village Hall in April. Parish Council Chairman Peter Coster presented his report - his last, as he will be standing down at the AGM on May 13th. He thanked all the councillors for their involvement throughout the year and gave a brief summary of their work. Representatives from eight village organisations gave a brief outline of their activities over the past year and District and County Councillor William Nunn spoke about key issues in Local and central government which would affect village residents.

There followed a lively discussion on how best to use the £1000 bequest from the previous Lord of the Manor. Four proposals were put to the meeting; to buy and plant more bulbs to further enhance the appearance of the village; to provide a new notice board outside the Church; to purchase the red telephone kiosk; to erect a flagpole on The Green. Mr Nunn advised the meeting that a grant for bulbs would be available under the Pride in Breckland scheme and those present agreed that the phone kiosk purchase at a cost of £1 should go ahead. After much debate it was decided that the flagpole was not a desirable way to use the money but that a notice board outside the Church would be of value to all. There was a strong feeling that consideration should be given to providing a play area for the children of the village. After much discussion on location of and need for such a facility, it was agreed that the Parish Council would support in principle any initiative to investigate the feasibility of a playground and it was suggested that approaches be made to the Village Hall Committee at its AGM. The Chairman closed the meeting by appealing

for residents to consider becoming a councillor and reminding everyone that the Parish **Council AGM is on May 13th** at Pansthorne B&B.
