Harvest Thanksgiving weekend was a lovely end to September. Many thanks must go to all the people who decorated the church so beautifully - the mix of Autumn colours glowed with welcome. There were good congregations for both celebration services, which were led by the Revd Rob Mellowship. It was good to have members of the Benefice Choir leading the music at Evensong, and singing a special Introit.

The Upper Waveney Benefice Festival on 16th & 17th was a resounding success! The heritage displays in St Nicholas' Church - of the Lopham Linen industry, with labelled examples & original artefacts, of the antique bibles, and of the collection of coins unearthed round the village attracted a constant stream of visitors. Some had a go at weaving themselves, and a group of young people made a section of their own video film about the village and its history. Such was the interest that several came back for a second time, some bringing their own treasures to share with us! The refreshment & homemade stalls did brisk business, and the Tombola almost sold out twice. In all we raised over £330 in church to add to the Festival fund. The display at the Methodist Chapel attracted considerable interest; the building itself was a village treasure discovered for the first time by some of its visitors. Very many thanks go to all those who helped make the weekend a success, either by making goodies, providing display items (especially Paul with his coins), or by being there to talk to the visitors and ensure everyone felt welcome.

The Merely Divas concert at Bressingham Church was a real treat for a large audience, a wonderful oasis of sound at the centre of the weekend.
