This is a true life narrative told by Neil Lanham from stories that were told to him by his Mother Ruby. In the show the audience will be drawn back to the period just before the First World War and then through the agricultural depression of the 1930s. It was, Ruby said, a time when, "if you hadn't got anything you were lucky because you hadn't got the worry of it. For sure as eggs are eggs you'd loose it". The narrative is supported by a PowerPoint presentation of Ruby's own photographs, digitally enhanced for the big screen, and each story is followed by an unaccompanied song from Andrew Stannard in his nutbrown East Suffolk voice. Everything you hear on the night will come straight out of the oral tradition, nothing having been taken from books.

North Lopham Parish Council

At the September meeting several on-going initiatives were reported. **SNAP:** Though



the village is not quite so high profile, the police have maintained random speed check visits - since July 37 verbal warnings and 17 fixed penalty tickets have been issued. Residents are reminded that any near misses, exceptional speeding in either of the Lophams should be reported to the police, on 0845 456 4567. Children's Play Area: the hunt for a site continues. The Council are making enquiries about land behind the Methodist Chapel, for either this or allotments. Pothole repairs: Talks with Barhale and the County Council Highways continue. Early morning noise: Crown Milling declined an invitation to discuss reducing this. Aerating/Filtering the village pond: has been investigated, but alternative action may be appropriate. A pond clean up is proposed for the end of October, so please watch for signs asking for volunteers to help. Thank you.

A Biomass Electricity Generation Plant has been proposed for Kenninghall, but NLPC was not consulted. Representations from individuals or Council members were invited up to 17th September - but if you still wish to get in touch the application number is 3PL/2010/0656/F; the website is at www.breckland.gov.uk

InternetAccess is difficult for some and still a mystery to others. Gareth Walters (tel: 01379 688058) has kindly offered to help residents with problems or learning. **Dog fouling** is still a problem in the village lanes - Please would dog owners use poop scoop bags & put them in the bins provided, or take them home. Thank you.

South Lopham Parish Council

The following points arose out of the meeting held in September. 1) The telephone kiosk at the junction of Primrose Lane and Church Road has now been acquired by the Parish Council which is considering various ideas for its use. Suggestions would be welcome - email robmad@btinternet.com or phone 01379 687776. 2) A working party is being organised to plant bulbs at various places around the village. Volunteers to assist would be most welcome. We are meeting in the White Horse car park on Saturday 9th October at 10am. Please bring along a suitable spade. 3) It was noted that at various points in the village hedges and/or verges are overgrown and unsightly. It would be much appreciated if the owners of the adjacent properties could tidy up these areas. 4) The Council received a report on the progress of the proposal by Breckland Council to delete the Settlement Boundary in the village. This would mean that only very limited categories of developments would be permitted, thereby inhibiting new building which might house young families, to the possible detriment of the future of St. Andrew's School. Although the formal consultation period has ended, the whole approval process will grind on for a year or more. Therefore, it is probably worthwhile for any further comments or objections to be sent to the Planning Department at Breckland Council. 5) The Council thanked its colleagues on North Lopham PC for their efforts with SNAP to ease traffic problems (see report from NLPC herein). Residents of South Lopham are also urged to report any accidents, near misses. speeding or unauthorised heavy vehicles to the police on 08456 4567. 6) The vacancy for Parish Clerk remains unfilled.
